The drains primary purpose has been compromised by the additional use of conveying irrigation water to nearby farmers. As a result, during rainfall and water shedding events, this drain is not properly sized to handle both irrigation water and runoff. The impact is that a large portion of the nearly level, low lying lands adjacent to this drain become flooded. It has happened several times over the past couple of decades and is likely to do so in future years as well. In her decision letter, Carina Weisbach acknowledged this issue and placed restrictions on the timing of manure applications to section 5-7-20 W4M. However, these restrictions are not sufficient. Corner's Pride plans to apply manure to portions of section 6 and 7, which share the same characteristics as section 5. They are nearly level, low lying, and adjacent to the drain. The pictures that were submitted show the degree of flooding that occurs in this area.

As a result, the contaminants will remain on the surface of the soil. Some of the known contaminants in manure include nitrates, phosphate, sodium and chloride. During the flood event, these contaminants will become suspended in the water and migrate from adjacent lands. Following the flood event, the drain will resume it's primary purpose of removing excess water from adjacent lands, including contaminants in the manure applied to the lands proposed in conversion or through irrigation; contaminants that we don't want and that can have degrading impacts to our farmland from increased salinity or increased sodium absorption ratio. 


Figure 1. Aerial overview of Corner's Pride Lands and surrounding lands. The image shows considerable flooding in proximity to the drain, particularly in section 5 and 7-007-20 W4M.
