## APPLICATION BY THE TOWN OF CANMORE TO CONSTRUCT A DEBRIS FLOOD RETENTION STRUCTURE AND ACCESS ROAD ON COUGAR CREEK

NRCB APPLICATION NO. 1601 ALBERTA ENVIRONMENT AND PARKS, WATER ACT FILE NO. 00384210 AND ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT REPORT

**TAKE NOTICE** that the Town of Canmore has applied to the Natural Resources Conservation Board (NRCB) and Alberta Environment and Parks (AEP) for approval to construct a debris flood retention structure on Cougar Creek. The Project location (14-34-024-10 W5M) is at the site of an existing debris net on Cougar Creek, approximately 2 km northwest of the Trans-Canada Highway.

## NATURE OF APPLICATION

The Town of Canmore has prepared and submitted an application for Approval under the *Water Act* (*WA*) for the activities associated with the construction and long-term management of the Proposal. The Town of Canmore has also prepared and submitted an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) report to Alberta Environment and Parks, which forms part of their application to the NRCB.
