Finally, below is some additional information provided by Alberta Transportation regarding the terrain and walking distances.

Update from Alberta Transportation:

For SR1, Point 1 is the river bottom and will be uneven terrain with river rock and debris and mostly no defined trails. It is about a 500 metre hike in.

Point 6, if we walk out to the dam footprint, is about a 1 km hike in through some tall grass and some uneven and undulating terrain with no marked trails.

The rest of the points involve stopping on the road verges and viewing from there.

Depending on the timing, we may not get to all points/stops we have planned.

For MC1 the view point for the dam is a trail off Hwy 66 and is about a 400 metre hike in. The rest of MC1 can be viewed from the roads.

I would recommend good hiking boots and high visibility vests. There are no construction sites so safety boots and hardhats are not mandatory.

We should also mention wildlife presence especially bears in the SR1 dam area which have been spotted there this spring.

We will have some maps and drawings available for handouts.

Below are more details for the June 21st site visit for the Springbank project. I do need to confirm numbers of people for group transportation planning.

Please confirm your participation to me by no later than Wednesday (June 7th).

Our itinerary is as follows:

June 21st

8 a.m. – participants to meet at the Grey Eagle Resort (3777 Grey Eagle Dr, Calgary, AB), located on the west side of Calgary.

8:30 a.m. (no later than) – introductions, organize into group transportation and depart no later than 8:30 a.m.

Morning – tour of Springbank project area

Lunch - Bragg Creek

Afternoon - tour of McLean Creek area

4 p.m. - return to Grey Eagle Resort

Details

Ground Transport

Alberta Transportation is providing the ground transportation for the day, from our meeting point at Grey Eagle. This will likely be two or three larger vehicles. You are responsible for getting yourself to and away from the Grey Eagle Resort prior to and after the site visit. I understand there is ample parking available.

Participants

There are currently 10 people confirmed from the federal review team; yet to be confirmed are 9 people from Alberta Environment and Parks and 4-5 from the Natural Resources Conservation Board. This will be a great opportunity meet others involved in the EA review!

Personal Protective Equipment

There is no active construction on the site and specific PPE are not required. The following are recommendations:

- Safety vest (strongly recommended)
- Appropriate gear for the weather (e.g., raingear)
- Appropriate gear for the elements (e.g., bug spray, sunscreen, hat)
- Drinking water, snacks
- Sturdy footwear and appropriate clothing some walking will be required to get into some areas; there may be vegetation and other outside hazards.

Lunch

As per the itinerary, lunch will be at the town of Bragg Creek. Participants will be responsible for purchasing or bringing their own lunch. There are a number of quicker lunch options in town.

I am a Project Manager with CEAA and managing the federal EA for the Springbank project.

Alberta Transportation is providing a site visit for the Federal Review Team on June 21st, which I understand you are interested in joining. There has been some discussion on the possibility of representatives from Tsuut'ina First Nation attending as well but I am not sure if this will materialize.

The tentative itinerary is as follows:

We will start our day around 8:00 or 8:30 am. We will tour the Springbank site in the morning and have lunch in Bragg Creek on our way to the McLean Creek site. As an estimate, we can likely be back to our meeting location comfortably by 4 pm.
