The co-permit holders shall comply with the requirements of the *Agricultural Operation Practices Act (AOPA)* and the regulations passed pursuant to that act.

The co-permit holders shall adhere to the descriptions contained in the filed applications for Registrations RA16055 and RA20045 together with the site plan, building plans and other attached documents, unless otherwise noted in the following conditions.

Operating conditions (brought forward from Registration RA16055)

1. Manure shall not be spread within 1,000 feet (304.8 m) of neighboring residences, unless the manure is injected into the soil or incorporated into the soil within 24 hours of spreading.
2. Owner/operator to maintain at all times high degree of cleanliness in and around livestock facilities to minimize odour nuisances for neighboring residents.

This registration becomes effective immediately. The registration conditions will remain in effect unless amended in writing by the NRCB.

Registration RA16055 is hereby cancelled and is no longer in effect, unless Registration RA20045 is held invalid, in which case the previous permit will remain in effect.

Registration RA20045 – Appendix

Existing Permitted Facilities

- Dairy barn (1,385 m²) (converted into a goat barn)
- Liquid manure concrete tank (4,000 m³) (not in use)
- L-shaped covered shelter (concrete pad)
- Nursery barn for kids (former calf barn)
- Outdoor corrals (2,250 m²)

Construction Conditions (already met)

(brought forward from Registration RA16055)

1. The concrete used to modify the manure storage and collection system in the dairy barn must have a minimum 28-day strength of 25 MPa. The permit holder shall provide written proof to the NRCB to confirm the specifications of the concrete used in the modification. This document must be provided to the NRCB prior to the inspection referenced in condition #2 below or by a later date stated by the NRCB.
2. The permit holder shall not allow livestock or manure in the dairy barn until the facility has been inspected by NRCB personnel and determined by them, in writing, to have been constructed in accordance with the terms and conditions of this registration.
3. The permit holder shall complete construction of the manure collection and storage portions of the dairy barn prior to November 30, 2018. Upon request, this deadline may be extended by the NRCB in writing.

(brought forward from Lacombe County Development Permit No 143/99)

- Solid manure storage pad to be concrete
- Concrete manure storage pad to have run-off control measures satisfactory to county
- Shelterbelt to be planted around concrete manure storage pad prior to start of expanded operation
- Prior to start of expanded operation, soil testing to be done by qualified professional on all lands on which manure is to be spread to determined proper manure application rates and adequacy of land base for spreading.
