Key Responsibilities

As an Environmental Specialist, your primary responsibilities include Supporting the Board by:

- 2. providing assistance in drafting public interest decision reports for non-energy resource projects

Under the *Natural Resources Conservation Board Act*, the NRCB determines whether proposed non-energy natural resource projects are in the public interest, considering social, environmental, and economic effects. Under the *Agricultural Operation Practices Act*, the NRCB is responsible for regulating confined feeding operations in Alberta, including application and compliance activities.

The Position:

This specialized professional position provides scientific and technical support to the NRCB to promote sustainable and responsible growth of Alberta's non-energy resource developments under the *Natural Resources Conservation Board Act* (NRCBA) and confined feeding operations under the *Agricultural Operation Practices Act* (AOPA).

Specific Responsibilities include:

NRCBA

- Review environmental impact assessment reports for proposed non-energy resource projects as a subject matter expert to ensure project impacts and technical aspects are understood.
- Provide assistance in drafting public interest decision reports for projects reviewed by the NRCB.
- Direct and supervise the work of contract consultants that may be required to provide specialized technical expertise as part of public interest reviews.

AOPA

- Assist with developing technical guidelines and other strategic documents that require consultation with other government departments and stakeholders.
- Assist NRCB field staff with technical aspects of permit application and compliance
 activities at confined feeding operations. This activity involves both office and field work to
 assess environmental conditions at confined feeding operations.
- Provide technical support to projects related to assessing impacts of agricultural nuisances (e.g., dust, odours) and manure management activities on the environment (e.g., groundwater quality).
- Identify knowledge gaps that must be addressed to facilitate the development of policy that supports a sustainable confined feeding operation industry.
